



HAMILTON DINGHY DOCK AT THE WESTERN END
OF BARR'S BAY WHARF POLICY

Mariners wishing to tie-up dinghies at the Corporation of Hamilton owned Barr's Bay Wharf are permitted to do so providing the following procedures are followed:

1. Dinghies are termed as small open boats or inflatable rubber boats **NO LONGER THAN 14 FEET** with a maximum beam of **6 FEET**.
2. Dinghies are permitted to tie-up in the western most area of Barr's Bay Wharf **only**. The area has signs and markings to indicate the position of the tie-up lines.
3. Dinghies tied to the Wharf lines must be kept in a seaworthy condition.
4. Local dinghies shall be identified by displaying the Department of Marine and Ports annual license decal. Dinghies owned by vessels visiting the Island shall be identified by displaying the annual license decal of the governing body the vessel is registered to.
5. Dinghies found outside the allocated tie-up space will be ticketed.
6. Vessels larger than 14' LOA found in the dinghy tie-up area will be ticketed.
7. Any abandoned vessels or vessels left tied to the dinghy tie-up area without identification **WILL BE DISPOSED OF**. All disposal costs or charges incurred will be recovered from the vessel owner.
8. Dinghies shall not be left on, or on top of any wharf, or any structure, or platform that forms part of any wharf.
9. Any dinghy that without good cause is tied to the wharf in a manner that prevents unhindered access, or in a manner that prevents other vessels from safely tying up to, or leaving the wharf, will be deemed to be illegally tied and may be ticketed and removed at the cost of the vessel owner.
10. There is no charge for in water tie-up of dinghies.
11. The tie-up of dinghies at Barr's Bay Wharf is at the owner's risk. The Corporation of Hamilton assumes no responsibility for accidents, theft or vandalism. Dinghy owners are responsible for securing their vessels.

12. All vessels must be removed from the Dinghy Dock at Barr's Bay Wharf whenever the Bermuda Weather Service issues a Hurricane Watch, meaning the possibility of hurricane force winds within 36 hours. All associated removal charges incurred as a result of the owner of a vessel failing to do so will be borne by the vessel owner.
