



PLEASURE BOAT DOCKING AT THE EASTERN END
OF BARR'S BAY WHARF POLICY

The following information pertains **only** to the most Eastern End of Barr's Bay Wharf owned by the Corporation of Hamilton. There are signs and markings to indicate the docking area.

1. All vessels using the most Eastern End of Barr's Bay Wharf must be annually registered with The Corporation of Hamilton.
2. Space is limited (to 2 vessels - each having a 22' LOA maximum) and registration/use is first-come, first-served, with annual fees paid to the Port Operations Office.
3. Use of Barr's Bay Wharf is at the discretion of the Corporation of Hamilton and may be denied or terminated at any time.
4. Vessels shall be identified by displaying the Department of Marine and Ports annual license Decal, and also the Corporation of Hamilton annual license decal.
5. All vessels registered to use the most Eastern End of Barr's Bay Wharf will be governed by CORPORATION OF HAMILTON BR 37/96 The Hamilton Boat Ordinance 1996.
6. Unregistered vessels found in the most Eastern End of Barr's Bay Wharf will be ticketed by Police.
7. Any abandoned vessels or vessels left tied to the most Eastern End of Barr's Bay Wharf without identification **WILL BE DISPOSED OF**.
8. Any registered Pleasure Boat that without good cause tied to the wharf in a manner that prevents unhindered access, or in a manner that prevents other vessels from safely tying up to, or leaving the wharf, will be deemed to be illegally tied and may be ticketed and removed at the cost of the vessel owner.
9. The registration fee is based on the space LOA maximum and is computed on a per 24 hour period.
10. The docking of registered Pleasure Boats at a Barr's Bay Wharf is at the owner's risk. The Corporation of Hamilton assumes no responsibility for accidents, theft or vandalism. Registered Pleasure Boat owners are responsible for securing their vessels.
